Our SSEM Mission **School and Primary** School is a composite of the following classes and sections:

- 1. Early childhood preschool at age 3 class; 12 students.
- 2. Early childhood preschool at age 4 class; 112 students.
- 3. KG-One class; 80 students.
- 4. KG-Two class; 70 students.
- 5. Grade One; 58 students.
- 6. Grade Two; **52** students.

The total students at **SSEM Mission School** and Primary School are now 384.

SSEM/EEM College and Bible School

College adult classes at the SSEM/EEM College for this semester; 25 students.

Luallok Bible School has 7 second-year students.

Financial Report - 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Again, God has provided, through generous people like you, the financial support SSEM has needed to advance its vision. We were sad to learn that one large grant expired; yet, a new (much smaller) organization has sprung up to support for SSEM.

The new group is called SēM (seam) — *Stitch to Equip Missions*. The group makes cloth bags and machine stitched ornaments to sell. <u>All</u> proceeds go toward SSEM. God is GOOD!

Starting in January of 2019, the SSEM bank account balance was \$10,402.73. During the year, deposits totaling \$39,309.11 were made. Praise God for faithful donors! Withdrawals were \$48,066: build the four-room school; finance the leadership training; design new logo and secure website; and, provide the missionary stipend. The current balance is \$1,726.81.

As you see funds are a constant need for our mission; so if God puts it on your heart, donations can be made directly to SSEM via our website or by check mailed to 3525 Windsor Ave., Apt 107, Dubuque, IA 52001.

God is moving in mighty ways, and I am sure God has even more plans for his people of South Sudan and for missionary, Paul Both.
